

Alvin Gene Boldt

Biographical Brief

Alvin (“Al”) Boldt was born in Reedley California on August 20, 1933, to Lydia (Siebert) and Henry Boldt. As a child Al embraced his farming family’s work ethic and became a lifelong farmer.

The family spoke low German and attended the Mennonite Brethren Church in Reedley. Al accepted Jesus as his Savior at the age of seventeen. During the Korean War, he served his country through the 1-W Program.

In 1955, Al married the love of his life, Bonnie Regehr.. They had three children together, Gene, Joan, and William. Al lived his faith in Christ daily through the way he treated others. He was humble, honest, treated people with dignity and supported the church through tithing and acts of service.

Al faithfully loved Bonnie throughout their 70 years together. In 1992, Al and Bonnie ‘retired’ and moved to Seal Rock, Oregon, where they purchased a small Christmas tree farm. Al often donated trees for fund raisers to Pacific Communities Hospital, churches, pastors, and nearby towns. Their church home became the Waldport First Baptist Church.

In 2016 Al was diagnosed with Alzheimer’s. The disease progressed slowly until 2021. Al passed away peacefully on July 6, 2024, at 6:52 AM while he slept with Bonnie, and William nearby.

Al is preceded in death by his parents and his son Gene. He is survived by his beloved Bonnie, daughter Joan (and Jim Ferrales), son William (and Audra Boldt), grandchildren; Kristin Ferrales, Andrew Ferrales, Hope (and Adam Lundquist), and Emma Boldt as well as great-grandchildren, Ameria Ferrales, Asher Ferrales, Eliot Ferrales, and Ansel Ferrales.
