# **Study Guide**

For the week of March 2, 2025

(Questions and Scriptures for further study)

Read Genesis 27:1-4. What request did Isaac make of Esau? What did Isaac intend to do?

What is a "blessing" as described here?

What had God already revealed about Jacob and Esau's descendants?

How did Isaac's conduct compare to God's intentions? (Think: How old were Esau and Jacob at this time? Boys?)

Read Genesis 27:5-17. Describe Rebekah's plot.

What subsequent events reveal she came from a deceitful family?

Evaluate her plan. Was it right or wrong? Why?

Describe and evaluate Jacob's objection and Rebekah's response. What further arrangements did Rebekah make?

Read Genesis 27:18-25. What questions did Isaac ask Jacob, and how did he respond?

Discuss Jacob's treatment here of his father and his brother.

Read Genesis 27:26-29. Describe the blessing Isaac gave Jacob.

Explain the fulfillment of this blessing. (Think: Did Isaac speak from his own ideas? Note Genesis 27:33,37. Explain.)

Read Genesis 27:30-40. Tell what happened when Esau arrived – 27:30-33.

Explain the relationship between this passage and Hebrews 12:17.

How did Isaac evaluate Jacob's conduct in 27:34-36?

Describe Isaac's blessing on Esau.

Read Genesis 27:41-46. What plot did Esau then devise? What lessons can we learn?

How did Rebekah respond?

Did things work out as she hoped?

What arrangements did she make with Isaac?

Why did God still give Jacob the promises of Abraham?

Did He justify Jacob's conduct here?

Can a man obtain God's favor by deceit?

What personal needs has the Holy Spirit exposed during this study? How can we pray with you about those needs?
